Day Tours

1. Lake Chala Day Trip

Overview: Visit this crater lake on the Tanzania-Kenya border, where you have the chance to spot wildlife and swim.

2. Materuni Waterfall & Coffee Tour

Overview

Experience East Africa's highest waterfall at 150 meters, located on the lush slopes of Mount Kilimanjaro. This tour also includes a visit to the Chagga tribe to learn about their traditional coffee-making process and lifestyle.

Itinerary

- **10:00 AM:** Pickup from your hotel in Moshi or Arusha.
- Drive for 45 minutes, stopping for scenic photos of Mount Kilimanjaro and surrounding hills.
- Visit local families to learn about their traditions and daily practices.
- Walk to Materuni Waterfall, where you can enjoy stunning views and relax over lunch.
- After lunch, participate in a hands-on coffee preparation session guided by locals.
- **3:00 PM:** Return to Moshi or Arusha.

3. Marangu Hiking Tour

Itinerary

- **8:00 AM:** Pick up from Moshi or Arusha and drive to Marangu Gate.
- Start a 6-hour hike to Mandara Hut (2,700m) and Maundi Crater. Enjoy lunch while taking in breathtaking views.
- Descend the same route through lush rainforests, where you may spot wildlife such as blue monkeys and Colobus monkeys.
- Visit Marangu or Kilasia Waterfalls before heading back to your hotel.

- Enjoy a guided tour led by a Maasai leader, covering their cultural practices, housing, and local food.
- Participate in activities such as livestock herding and traditional cooking.

- Lunch will be served at the village before returning to Moshi or Arusha.

Beach Holidays

Zanzibar Island is famous for its spices and the slave trade of the 19th century. The island is more than a stopping point on an itinerary; it can be seen as a destination. What the island offers is a unique combination of outstanding beaches, delicious food, the best sunsets, engaging activities, such as a visit to a working spice farm, and the cultural delights of Stone Town. Our safaris in Zanzibar are conducted by knowledgeable guides with deep knowledge of local culture.

Spice, Fruits & Food Market Tour

Spices from Zanzibar are famous worldwide, and a holiday to Zanzibar would be incomplete without a visit to the spice plantations. The spice tours are actually quite informative and good value. Spice tour is probably the best way of seeing the countryside and meeting members of rural communities. The geographical nature of the island makes the spice tour to be organized in many villages both in Unguja and Pemba. However, the popular village for spice tours is Kijichi or Kizimbani,

approximately 5 kilometres from Stone Town. The tour starts at 8:30 am and takes 2 - 3 hours, depending on the activities to be done.

You will be overwhelmed by the abundance of botanical species growing in these gardens – exotic spices, fruits and vegetables. Many spices have medicinal properties and are still used by the locals to cure certain illnesses. Savour different spices, such as cinnamon, cardamom, nutmeg, vanilla, or black pepper. Taste a variety of fruits ranging from the rose apple to the guava. Some rare plants like henna, perfume trees, and lipstick trees are used for their value in preparing cosmetics. Our guides will take you on a walking tour of the spice farms at Kizimbani.

Dolphins tour

The tour begins after breakfast when you are picked up from your hotel and transferred to the fishing village of Kizimkazi. Before the tour starts, you will be given a life jacket demonstration followed by a briefing on the day's excursion. You will then board the dhows and set off searching for the Dolphins (85% chance). The species frequently found at Menai Bay are Spinner and Bottlenose dolphins. You can swim with the dolphins as long as they stay close to the boat, but it is unlikely you will be able to touch them, as they are wild animals. The guide will take you to one of the selected snorkelling locations during the tour. On the way to your hotel, you will have an opportunity to visit the site of a 12th-century mosque, the earliest evidence of Islam in East Africa, and is thus worth a visit for both natural and cultural reasons.

Stone Town

Stone Town is the heart of tourism in Zanzibar, an old town with winding narrow streets, historical buildings, and the best food market in the evenings. This part of Zanzibar is referred to by the local people as Mji mkongwe (Old town). Our guided safaris in this part of Zanzibar include visits to the House of Wonders, old dispensary, Old Fort, former slave market, bazaars, old harbour, Anglican cathedral church and fruit, spices and promising market.

Prison Island tour

Prison Island, also known as Changuu Island, lies just off the Old Stone Town, about 30 minutes by boat from Stone Town. Changuu Island was used as a penitentiary for rebel slaves by the sultans from the 1860s until the end of the slave trade. After this, the British began building a prison on the island under the guidance of First Governor Lloyd Matthews. This was completed in 1894. However, the 'prison' was only ever used as a quarantine centre for possible yellow fever victims. Nowadays, the island allows you to escape for some peace and quiet. Also, the island is home to the giant land tortoises that were imported from Seychelles in the 19th Century.

The tour starts from 9:00 am-3:30 pm. There, you will be able to see the Giant tortoises, beautiful marine creatures, and coral reefs and it's also the best site for Snorkeling. Once on the island, you have the opportunity to feed and pet the tortoises, some of which are over a hundred years old. If you have time, you may also like to stroll through the forested interior, where you will see a wide variety of birds, colourful peacocks, bats and beautiful butterflies. Keep your eyes peeled, too for the shy and elusive Duikers – an unusual tiny antelope species.

Zanzibar Red Colobus monkeys

Jozani forest lies about 35 km south-east of Zanzibar town. It contains about 100 tree species from a total of 43 families. One of the most famous and endearing residents of the Jozani National Park is the Zanzibar Red Colobus monkey. Found only on the main island of Zanzibar, the Zanzibar Red Colobus is recognised as a separate species and is believed to be endemic to Zanzibar. A visit to Zanzibar is not complete without seeing one of the rarest monkeys in Africa, with less than 2000 species remaining in the world. Colobus Monkeys are leaf-eating arboreal species and spend almost 85% of their time resting. It is somewhat surprising to find, therefore, that the opposable thumb deemed most essential for dexterous arboreal primates, is reduced to a mere stump in the Colobus family (hence the name Colobus-from the Latin for

“deformed”). Our local guide will take you on a walking trail inside the forest to all these wonders of Zanzibar.

Zanzibar National Museum of History & Culture

The House of Wonders (Beit-Al-Ajaib) is a vast square-shaped building with several stories, surrounded by a tier of pillars and balconies and topped by a large clock tower. It was built around 1883 as a ceremonial palace for Sultan Barghash and was the first building in Zanzibar to have electric light and an electric lift. Not surprisingly, when it was built, the local people called it Beit el Ajaib, meaning the House of Wonders. It was damaged around 1896 during the Shortest War in History (only lasting 40 minutes). The palace was the target of British bombardments intended to force Sultan Khalid Bin Barghash, who had tried to seize the throne after the death of Sultan Hamad, to abdicate in favour of a British nominee.

After its rebuilding, Sultan Hamad, who ruled Zanzibar from 1902 to 1911, used its upper floor as a residential palace until his death. Nowadays, the house is used as a National Museum of History & Culture. Inside the house, there are exhibits on the dhow culture of the Indian Ocean (ground floor) and on Swahili civilisation and 19th-century Zanzibar (1st floor). Everything is informatively labelled in English and Swahili, and well worth visiting. Just inside the entrance is a life-size mtepe – a traditional Swahili sailing vessel made without nails, the planks held together with only coconut fibres and wooden pegs. Spice Tour in Zanzibar

- Morning: Visit spice farms, sample spices, and interact with local farmers.
